

Scripture nugget - Every human heart seeks true joy and rest

My soul rests in God alone, from Whom comes my salvation. God alone is my rock and salvation, my fortress; I shall never fall (Psalm 62:2-3).

Jesus teaches us how to find true joy. His teachings are clear. We are not required to do extraordinary feats to find happiness but the key to true joy is simply filial obedience to God. If you keep My commandments, you will remain in My love, just as I have kept My Father's commandments and remain in His love. I have told you this so that My joy may be in you and your joy may be complete (John 15:10-11). The Jews distinctly noticed Christ taught with profound authority.
